Motion 18-081: RCM/Keep It Simple: To make the following changes the HASC policy Article XIII Line K: ***From*** “The HASC will provide (1) men’s room and/ or (1) women’s room night as needed, at the FRSC meeting place when it is in excess of (50) fifty miles from the HASC meeting place. When the FRSC meeting place is within (50) fifty miles of HASC meeting place, the HASC will not provide a room(s).” ***To*** “The HASC will provide (1) men’s and/or (1) women’s room night, as needed, at the RSC meeting place.” Purpose: 1. The difference between where HASC meets can be either very close or very far away from where the RCM’s actually live, 2. Regional weekends are work intensive on Saturdays and Sundays. POLICY REPORT 8-12-18

The policy subcommittee met at 5:30 pm on Monday, August 6. We read the 8th Concept and discussed Motion# 18-081. Which was made by the RCM and seconded by Keep it Simple to make the following change to our HASC policy. In Article XIII, Line K: From: "The HASC will provide (1) men's room and/ or (1) women's room night as needed, at the FRSC meeting place when it is in excess of (50) fifty miles from the HASC meeting place. When the FRSC meeting place is within (50) fifty miles from the HASC meeting place, the HASC will not provide a room(s)." To: "The HASC will provide (1) men's and/ or (1) women's room night as needed, at the FRSC meeting place." Following discussion of members present, it was decided that the motion does not conflict with the 12 Steps, 12 Traditions or 12 Concepts. It is an obvious change to policy. It was, however noted that this will have a financial impact on the area as it will essentially fund hotel rooms for every Regional meeting. It was further noted that this change to policy also affects a budget that was voted on and approved by groups, who were under the impression that HASC would only pay for rooms in excess of 50 miles. This could have a negative spiritual impact that speaks to the integrity of our voting processes. One suggestion to avoid this problem would be to make the motion active at the start of the next fiscal year, before the group approval of the RCM budget. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the Serenity Prayer.

RCM II Report – August 2018

Pertinent issues discussed at July's RSC:

- We discussed getting Area subcommittees involved in Region again. The possibility of doing something similar to the GSR Assembly as a time for subcommittee chairs to get together and discuss problems and solutions. There is such a wellspring of knowledge and experience throughout our region that it would really benefit Area subcommittees to participate. Twice a year seemed to be the agreed upon amount.
- Greater Orlando Area submitted an amendment on one of the motions in the CAR Report. (regarding DRT/MAT -Drug Replacement Therapy/Medically Assisted Treatment) Our RD and AD took it to World and, although the motion failed, there was a lot of discussion and the workgroup will be taking it into account –World appreciated the discussion and thought put into it. We have the power to bring up ideas and be heard!
- One idea that was brought up for Area Conventions was to have workshops on subcommittees and service work and have them filling concurrent time slots.
- The Behind the Walls workgroup has built a website for members who participate in the Behind the Walls meetings. Its purpose is to log visits, accumulate data, and submit reports. And all of these functions serve to create accountability. The website address is: <https://www.behindthewalls.us/>. It was suggested that the H&I Chair be the liaison with the Corrections Resource Coordinator and H&I Coordinator. [huge deal, pioneers in this] There will be a presentation on the new site during September's RSC so if anyone is interested come out and check it out!
- I also spoke to the Behind the Walls coordinator about Cindy D's issue—He said that they don't do any kind of attendance verification and that usually the facility will do a roll call sheet. I passed along Cindy's contact info and he said that he would reach out to her.
- New Mexico recently had a convention and 4 inmates from a low security prison were able to attend.
- From FRC Board - The board feels that overall FRCNA 37 was successful and the majority of feedback we have received was positive.
 - This year was a challenge with regards to the hotel room block and what has been referred to as partial pays/financial hardship registrations. With regards to the hotel rooms, our room block was 800 room nights which was over 100 less than the previous last two years in anticipation of a smaller convention. To not have to pay the attrition (damages due hotel for not reaching the contracted room nights) we needed to have 680 room nights booked in our room block and we missed the mark. Our room night reservations ended up at 576 which resulted in a deficit of 104 room nights. This cost us \$125.00 per room night not booked. We were able to negotiate with the hotel to allow us to apply ½ of the \$13,000 attrition towards additional food and beverage. Consequently, we ordered an additional 90 plus gallons of coffee, had cake and coffee at the Thursday night event, added a Friday dinner and provided breakfast sandwiches and pastries in hospitality. The balance of \$6,500 was paid to hotel. Concerning the partial pay/financial hardship registration challenge – we saw a decrease in the amount received from financial hardship registrations while the percentage of financial hardship registrations remained consistent. We also heard a lot comments from our members – “I never pay for FRCNA, I'm only here for the day, I am making a donation and I only want to go to a meeting – isn't this a meeting?” The financial impact of this is significant. This year we had lost revenue of \$7,287 from financial hardship registrations (I calculated this by taking the number of Page 25 RSC Minutes July 15 2018 these registrations at our onsite registration price for the days Wednesday through Friday and the number of these

registrations on Saturday at the Saturday only price, adding those figures and subtracting what we collected). We would like to remind the members of Florida Region that while we do have workshops and meetings at FRCNA, our workshops and speaker meetings are not just a meeting but a part of the paid event.

- o NA Symbol was tilted on the FRCNA logo because it was on the lion's shoulder.
 - o "Shattering the Illusion" is next year's theme.
 - o In response to not having a Spanish meeting last year one Spanish speaking meeting was held. The meeting was well attended and will influence our decisions moving forward.
 - o We are excited that this year was the first time we were able to include the Bermuda Area, Puerto Rico, and St. Croix via Zoom to the Saturday night meeting, Clean Time Count Down, and Roll Call.
- The PR coordinator gave the Heartland Area PR subcommittee a shout out for how busy they've been!

The newcomer packages that they do have are paid for by other members who donate when they pay for their registration. They are on a first come, first serve basis for anyone with 30 days or less. They will have meeting lists of local meetings available for anyone who isn't able to pay for registration or get a newcomer package.

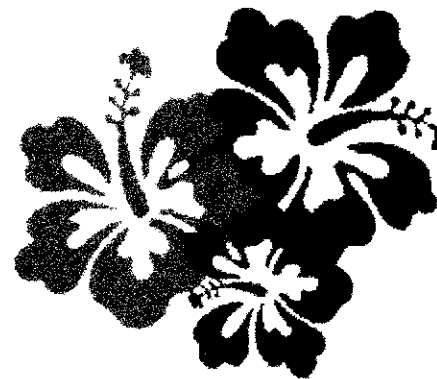
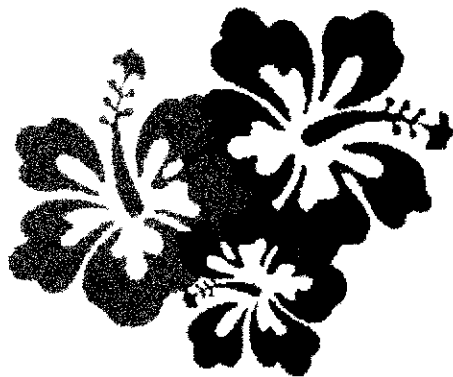
