RCM 1 Report to HASC, August 2022

I am an addict; my name is Ron. I am Heartland Area's Regional Committee Member 1 (RCM1). For those of you who don't know what I do, here are the highlights:

- Just as you GSRs are representatives for your respective group at HASC, I am a representative for the Heartland Area at the Regional Service Committee (RSC). I am a liaison between our Area and the Florida Region (and the rest NA, inclusive of NA World Services).
- RSC weekend is held every other month, typically in Orlando or Tampa. It is a weekend-long service event where all the RCMs from all over the Florida Region get together, as well as the Regional Delegate and Alternate Delegate (RD and AD, respectively), Regional Coordinators (PR, H&I, IT, etc.), Human Resources (HRP), FRCNA, RSO and others. This is the time when, much like here at HASC, we all get together to collaborate, carry NA's message, and help each other. We discuss any issues that an area may be having and provide each other with experience, strength, and hope –and potentially create workgroups to help find solutions for more complex issues. We hear the reports from all the different Coordinators, boards, and the news from NA World from the RD/AD team. We vote our area's conscience on proposals (motions) from the Region and World.
- Every RSC weekend, the RCM Team provide a report of all the things going on in our Area (issues, events, votes, etc.).
- Then, every month, here at HASC, we pass along the information that was covered at RSC, so (hopefully), GSRs can deliver information back to home groups.

- Any member is welcomed to join in on an RSC weekend! No service commitments or clean time required. All we ask is that if you're staying in a room, you provide a report to HASC about what you saw, learned, or participated in while you were there.

Treasurer Report

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On May 1, 2022, the opening bank balance was \$33,734.20. After deposits of \$12,403.40 and expenses of \$20,667.21 on June 30, 2022, the ending book balance was \$41,857.08. After deducting \$10,000.00 withheld for the next RSC, the Prudent Reserve of \$11,000.00, a Women in Service Donation of \$75.00, the GSR Assembly Reserve of \$2,000.00, and the Florida Service Symposium Reserve of \$16,000.00 the available balance was \$2,782.08.

As of RSC held on July 17, 2022, we received \$19,713.34 in income, which includes \$12,500.00 from FRCNA and had \$5,090.35 in expenses. Additionally, the RSC Treasurer allocated the monthly reserve of \$500.00 for the GSR Assembly & \$1,000.00 the Florida Service Symposium. Therefore, after RSC business the available balance was \$15,905.07.

Fellowship Development

Area Support Group There were about 40 members present both in person and virtually. The following topics were discussed: Not meeting quorum at ASC meetings and how is it handles How does an area get connected as a 501C-3 through our RSO? Activities Committees putting on “free” events and relation to Seventh Tradition How do we generate more meeting attendance? How to keep the newcomer coming back
** Note – On Sunday at our RSC meeting an area brought up an H&I question during the Fellowship Development report and while the question was answered by our H&I resource coordinator it was noted that this was a good reason for Area Subcommittee Chair-people and members of those subcommittees to attend Area Support Group each Florida Regional Service Conference Area Support Group.

Afternoon session discussing the suggestion by the World Board to transition to a three-year World Service Conference cycle. At this time this is only a suggested solution to the long-going discussion about the sustainability of the conference as it is. While there was lengthy and lively discussion there were many questions, many having to do with the actual workings and purpose of the World Service Conference. The purpose of the Regional and Alternate Delegates was also discussed. A list of the Pros and Cons of a Three-Year cycle that were identified and a result of both the discussion and the many questions posed.

H & I Resource Coordinator Report

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- The last couple of months H&I continued to connect with the Area subcommittee chairs.
- H&I continues compiling a list of all the facilities that NA holds H & I Meetings in the Florida Region

Public Relations Resource Coordinator Report

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- PR gave a presentation to the Director of Clinical Services at South Seminole Hospital they are a part of, Orlando Health hopefully this meeting will open doors other Orlando Health Hospitals.

Regional PR also meet with Recovery Connections of Central FL, which is part of the Florida Dept of Children and Family. This is a recovery center for people in recovery to utilize the facility as resource to have meeting and to fellowship They are going to include NA help line and meeting list and have offered meeting space.

FRSC PR had a learning day for PR week in the Orlando Area with the topic of the 3rd tradition with the focus on how we welcome new members that may be using MATS and DRT.

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Technology Resource Coordinator Report

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Florida Region is still looking for a Technology Alternate Resource Coordinator. RCM's were again asked to please take this back to our areas and inquire with your local tech members. Go to <https://www.naflorida.org/tech/> for more info.

IT has been communicating with HRP about expanding the technology realm to not only include the positions of technology resource coordinator and alternate but to create a team of trusted servants. An IT dream team if you will. Currently, there are a lot of different aspects to "everything tech" and it's a lot to expect one or even two people to know. Creating a team would allow this position to be less intimidating because it will be less about tech knowledge and more about delegation.

Corrections Resource Coordinator Report

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Corrections need volunteers to lead afternoon Zoom meetings for the NW Florida Reception Center pilot program for Zoom behind the walls meetings. Corrections are down to the last parts of the talks so expect to have meetings running within the next few months!

The DOC has an email problem so sometimes the volunteer forms don't get through. If you don't get an email right away when you submit your first volunteer form, (check spam), then contact me to give you another link to try.

The corrections workgroup consists of several related projects that serve to bring the message of NA recovery to the addicts behind the walls in the state of Florida. We also work with and educate the administration at the state level DOC regarding the continued success of NA to improve the lives of those they serve. Please be aware that working with the DOC does not mesh well with the spirit of rotation and does not sync up with the spirit of anonymity.

These top level projects are:

Behind the Walls: taking meetings into and building home groups that exist behind the walls of state and federal correctional institutions. This includes literature delivery to institutions to support this effort. The end game for this project is to have the addicts behind the walls running their own meetings. Depending on the institution, there are varying levels of this occurring.

The Inmate Step working guide group is alive and well and anonymously working steps through the mail with those behind the walls. This group is based out of the Gold Coast area. The last numbers I received in October was that around 30 addicts were working steps anonymously with this group.

The Bridging the Gap program is alive and well and addicts are being scheduled to meet those who are getting released at a meeting. Recently as part of brainstorming during the workgroup, the bridging the gap program is being opened outside of just those within the corrections workgroup. There are several members in various H&I subcommittees across the region that we have found would be willing to meet members after their release. Please bring up at your H&I areas if you would like to share your contact list with us for your area for this effort.

The Between the walls program is still in beta and should be starting in the next few months. This will start at the NW Florida Reception Center, and we are still working out the details. This institution was chosen by Tallahassee since everyone at that institution has less than a year left to serve on their sentence.

This means you will be able to chair a Zoom meeting from the comfort of your couch where all the participants are behind the walls at a Florida institution. Please contact me or the workgroup because we need volunteers to do this!

One of the goals of Corrections is to get the NA literature on the tablets at the Florida DOC institutions. Corrections has spoken with NAWS as well as spoken with DOC leadership in Tallahassee and it looks like it's a go!

The workgroup meets every other Thursday from 8-9p over Zoom.

FRSO BOD continues to deal with the supply challenges from NAWS. You may notice some of our IP's are on different colored paper because of supply chain issues. All our literature is printed in China and getting our literature into the country continues to be problematic. Please be patient with FRSO and NAWS.

You will notice an increase in the freight rates but please be aware that we are simply passing on the freight increases to you that RSO is getting. To cut freight costs, if the future, FRSO will no longer ship backorders. If we are out of stock in an item, RSO will ask that you include the backorder in your next order. If you have paid for the item, you will be given a credit on your next order. Freight costs have exceeded \$35,000 this last year and it is incumbent on RSO Board to try our best to control those costs.

FRC Board Report

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FRCNA 40 was a great success!!

Newcomer donations amounted to \$2,831.00. The number of packets available for distribution (188 based on \$15.00 per registration) and FRCNA gave 52 basic texts to newcomers at the Saturday night speaker meeting.

FRCNA had some Covid related challenges this year with several reports that Covid was spread at FRCNA. FRC Board reports that Covid is now a part of our everyday lives and will continue to affect us today and going forward. The best thing we all can do is exercise personal judgment about hugs and mask wearing. It is the individual addict's responsibility to decide what is best for them.

FRC Board is in negotiations for 2024, 2026 and 2027 which will require at least \$10,000 per year deposit when the contracts are signed.

HUMAN RESOURCE PANEL REPORT

NAWS ask anyone interested in nomination for a world service position at WSC 2023 to acquire an RBZ (Region, World Board, Zonal Forum) recommendation. RBZ recommendations provide a foundation, typically based on the service body's direct experience with the candidate, for the HRP and the WSC to identify the best candidates for nomination and election at the WSC. The deadline for submitting an RBZ recommendation is 30 September 2022.

Historical data from WSC elections indicate that Conference participants have the greatest confidence in nominees with an RBZ recommendation. In fact, since the start of the RBZ process in 2006, 16 years ago, all but two new World Board members have had at least one RBZ source. Candidates who do not come through the RBZ process are seldom nominated and rarely elected. Those candidates are often confused and disappointed with the outcome of the process. Considering nominees without an RBZ adds a stream of work for all of us that offers little benefit to anyone. We are confident in our decision to ask all candidates to obtain an RBZ recommendation for this cycle's nomination process. We believe this approach is in the spirit of the leadership identification principles discussed in the Fourth Concept for NA Service.

A worksheet is available to help service bodies identify and evaluate potential candidates for an RBZ recommendation.

The worksheet includes an overview of the RBZ process, a timeline, and questions to ask candidates. It also has a link to the online form for submitting an RBZ recommendation. Service bodies should feel free to use or adapt the work- sheet as they see fit. The worksheet is available in English, Spanish, and Portuguese, in the HRP folder of the Conference Participant Dropbox. And by the way, there is no limit on RBZ recommendations from one service body.

HASC

I arrived at the Rosen Center on July, 15th.

This addict was able to attend a NA meeting that evening, where the topic was the JFT-eighth step. That's right where I am. I got phone numbers from my Predecessors.

Saturday morning, I attended fellowship development. The topics were as follows,

1. How do we establish a quorum? Most areas follow Robert's rules of order.
2. How to increase meeting attendance? How to welcome the Newcomer and keep them coming back?

It was suggested that we give nearby treatment Facilities meeting information. Also to have greeter and invite addicts to join the home group. Then try and get the new home group member into service at the home group level. The discussion of how a large number of meetings in an area can effect attendance at some meetings.

3. A concern about the flow of NA seventh tradition funds from home groups to the service structure when a home group does not believe a service committee is following the 7th Tradition.
